Explore

Appleby – our historical market town is just a couple minutes drive where you will find a castle, lovely river walks and a swimming pool. There are 2 small supermarkets, takeaways, butchers, bakers and cafes as well as some great local shops. The railway station is on the Carlisle to Settle line - famous for steam trains, why not take a day trip to Kirkby Stephen or Skipton.
